#### a) County Councillor Report

(taken before item 10f) LH advised that the County Deal will bring much-needed funding into Norfolk. In answer to DL's question, she advised that this will not help with the challenges of this year's budget. LH noted excellent service from Highways in Freethorpe. DL advised that grup clearance and pothole filling had taken place recently.

By telephone GN sent a reminder to download the Bin App. JC advised the meeting that Broadland grant funding had been received by three local groups for young people.

JF advised that the Jubilee post at the Manor has been fixed. He reported a busy tree planting season across Broadland, with over £5,000 worth of trees planted. - b) <u>CiLCA training</u> is on target with 3/5 units completed and 2/5 submitted.



- c) Quarterly Finance Checks MB advised the checks had been completed, with no issues.
- d) Budget and Precept 2023/24 Parish Council received and discussed a report. Increased costs for insurance, services, pay and elections were acknowledged, along with a large outlay from reserves in 2022 to make safe the Freethorpe Playing Field trees. Investment in the play areas over the last two years means the maintenance budget is reduced, offsetting some cost pressures. Parish Council debated four options for the precept, and decided that a 6.16% rise in the precept is necessary to balance the budget, increasing by £1.48 the annual band D council tax bill, which rises to £50.98. The precept will be £16,874. The budget was unanimously **agreed**. The precept was unanimously **agreed**. In response to a query from GN, AM advised that S106 money must be claimed by 2025-26.
- e) Recycling Credits AM reported the tonnages claimed for the year. Although the volumes are similar to last year, the trend is significant reduction in recycling at the banks. JC proposed more publicity. DL observed that a better price might be obtained for textiles.

### 10. Update on Ongoing Matters and Projects

## a) Speed Management

At three speed machine sites volumes and speeds were down. 85th percentile speeds were: School Road 27.6mph (down from 28.4), Chapelfield 32.4mph (down from 33.2), The Green near the shop 28.7mph (down from 29.0). Thank you to those who are slowing down and driving carefully through our village. Figures from the Common, coming from Southwood, were less encouraging, with volumes slightly up and 85th percentile speed increasing from 31.9mph to 33.0. Of 18,095 vehicles over one in four broke the speed limit. A remarkable total of 134 drivers in 4 weeks were clocked at over 40mph in a 30mph limit. This month's analysis will be shared with the Police for information. It was noted that the Police are now carrying out frequent speed checks and issuing fines in Freethorpe. PLEASE DRIVE SAFELY. f) Electronic Vehicle Charging Point

Parish Council discussed a decision paper on the proposal from Norfolk County Council. In response to questions, LH advised that Lingwood are going ahead, but not Beighton; a decision would be preferred by end of March but could roll forward. NS suggested that a fast charger rather than slow would be better at Freethorpe if feasible. JC thought one charger would be enough rather than two. In considering surveying residents about the likely usage, MB pointed out that the main users would probably be visitors to the Hall or workers at the school. LH took a copy of the Parish Council's report to follow up with the Project Team.

g) Wickhampton Pond
