e) Notice of conclusion of audit – this was noted by Parish Council.

Grants and donations - all recipients have been advised of the donation made last year f) and asked to complete the new form evidencing need and benefit of the donation. Perspective was provided by the rule of thumb that a donation of £300 is effectively £1 Council Tax per resident. Parish Councillors made the following comments: (1) The importance of the Village Hall to the community and the need for the contribution towards running costs and kitchen improvements was agreed. However PB felt that the sum is a very large amount. PC wondered whether the hire charges are too high. JF observed that new facilities will improve the hall and make it more likely to get bookings. GN advised that other local village halls are struggling and the asset needs to be maintained. Village Hall to be asked to share its accounts as in previous years. ACTION AM (2) JF said that, although the budget was for £250 towards tree wardens, he would be delighted with £100. NS accepted, expressing his gratitude for great value of the work of the tree wardens in the parish. (3) Royal British Legion donation was increased as the cost of wreaths had gone up, and also in line with the Council's Armed Forces Covenant, as noted by GN. (4) It was agreed that the bowls club be asked to complete a request form regarding a recent approach for support for the green repairs. GN suggested next year's member's grant might be applied for. It was also noted that the football club are asking for additional services from grounds maintenance, which should also be assessed and brought back to Parish Council.

The following donations were agreed. This commits all the grants & donations budget

except for a residual £315 in the section 137 budget.

- a) For decision (1) Public Spaces Protection Order was noted. (2) Town and Parish Council Summit is on 9th November 9:30-12:30. (3) Battle of Britain commemoration had passed (4) Community At Heart nominations 2024 was noted. (5) Cluster Meeting at Beighton on 21st Sept- MB to attend (6) Himalayan Balsam on Wickhampton Marsh – JF advised that this mustn't be touched now as the seedpods will spread - it can only be dealt with in spring (7) Volunteer survey respondent on A47 dualling - AM. (8) Noise disturbance at the Plantation the particular problems of the previous weekend, when motor cycles were making a loud noise late at night and in the early morning, were discussed. GN has become involved as District Councillor, and has been assured that Environmental Health and the Police will be working together to find a resolution. (9) Police Priority Setting meeting on 21st Sept – AM to attend. (10) Naming of 75 The Green as Green View Way. Public comments were that this is slightly misleading as there isn't a village green as such to view. However, the name choice rests with the developers not the Parish or District Councils.
- b) For information Parish Council noted (1) Park and Ride Update the re-opening of the Postwick Park and Ride was noted, although PB felt the "Use It or Lose It" messaging in the Eastern Daily Press was unhelpful, especially given that the fare cap is still in effect for competing bus services. ACTION AM (2) East Anglian Coast & Estuary Conference 12th Oct and (3) Mindful Towns and Villages Project & Training.

Planning 9.

a) New Applications - information provided on the bus stop improvements was shared and it was agreed that more detail is needed to be able to comment further.

c) Enforcements – two unchanged open cases were noted.

10. Update on Ongoing Matters and Projects

a) Speed Management - Parish Council was pleased to see the new School Safety flashing 20mph signs in operation and agreed to write to thank our County Councillor, Lana Hempsall, and NCC Highways for their funding and support. We hope that these signs will encourage greater caution by drivers at a dangerous junction resulting in a measurable reduction in **ACTION AM** speed there.

In the meantime, the Police are still carrying out frequent speed checks and handing out fines near the Village Hall. The latest speed figures are as follows. On the Green by the Manor House, 85th percentile speeds were down from 31.6mph to 30.9mph on higher volumes of 31,086 vehicles. Five in six people kept within the speed limit. On the Common, near 111, 85th percentile speeds were down from 32.3 to 32.0 on increased volumes of 24,726 vehicles. Four in five people kept within the speed limit.

Parish Council agreed the assessment and costs of the SAM machine repair.

b) Play Area Inspections - an initial update on the surfacing options was considered and will be brought back for decision. No significant issues found in latest inspections.

c) Electronic Vehicle Charging Point (EVCP) - further information required from Village Hall on insurance implications, which will be raised once the Janet Church Memorial evening has passed.

d) Wickhampton Pond - waiting on NpLaw.

e) Rampant Horse - The Parish Council was disappointed that its Pride in Place grant application for a valuation of the Rampant Horse was rejected. The Rampant Horse Preservation Society (RHPS) has advised the landlord that it will not be able to submit a bid within the 6-month protected period for a community bid. A community bid can be made any

- time, and it was agreed to check with Broadland whether the valuation grant application can be resubmitted.
